Parish Worship

Some of our churches are opening for private prayer across our parishes having considered the transmission risks and the resources to deep clean. Suckley Parochial Parish Council has chosen not to open as they cannot open every day. Alfrick and Leigh PCCs have opted to open two days a week (allowing at least three days between openings) which means there is no need to deep clean.

They are both opening Sundays 10.00am - 6.00pm and Wednesdays 10.00am - 6.00pm from 28 June.

All the necessary precautions will have been taken including notices reminding anyone wishing to enter to pray (no sightseeing) to sanitise their hands, keep 2m distance, be aware of the one entrance, etc. There will also be a system of indicating where someone has sat to pray to protect anyone else coming in after.

All our churches though will be open for funerals with limited numbers. The number will depend on the calculations which have currently been worked out with 2m distancing between households.

We now await the Government's announcement around having services – and again the calculations of how many we can have in church will be the same as for funerals.

Our Church continues to be alive and active but due to COVID-19 our buildings must remain closed except as above.

However, our worship, prayers and praise, alongside reflections and our care for each other continues. And so (until we meet again)May the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with us evermore. *Amen*

Citizens Advice Bureau

I work in retail and my company says it's starting to look at how we might reopen later in the summer. This is making me so anxious, even though I don't have any special health issues. I'm going to wear a mask, but not all the customers may do so. I used to take the bus to work, I don't have a car and I think it's too far to cycle. And I'm not even sure if my kids will be back at school by then! The thought of returning to work is keeping me awake at night. Do I have to go back to work?



It's understandable you're feeling anxious. However, the short answer to your question is yes, you do need to comply with any reasonable management request to return to work. The key here is "reasonable." The government has published specific guidance for different businesses on the steps they can take to minimise coronavirus transmission. If you don't think they're complying, or are putting your health at risk, you should talk to them about this. Similarly, they should listen to your concerns about using public transport. You could, for instance, ask to travel at a quieter time of day. And the government has said that if you're unable to work because of childcare issues your employer can continue to furlough you.

We would suggest approaching this as a problem that you and your boss can solve together. But if you do get a bad reaction, you could report your employer to the Health and Safety Executive. You should also get advice about your legal rights in this situation.

The Sphere Magazine Story (updated from March 2013)

In 1983 John Herbert was appointed Rector and decided to produce a Benefice magazine, giving it the title The Sphere. Prior to that, separate leaflets for each parish had been available - the one for Suckley being produced by Gwynneth Brookes, who became secretary to John Herbert. Three hundred and fifty copies of The Sphere magazine were produced. Articles and events of interest were typed up on *Gestetner* waxes by Edna Davis, printed by Graham Jeynes on an old machine in a shed in the Rectory garden, and this first copy was delivered free of charge for parishioners to sample news and views from the whole benefice. Edna was subsequently replaced by Val Cole, Wendy Howard and Cath Hall as the magazine continued. The Rector soon relinquished his overriding role and Peggy Johnson was called upon to act as Editor with Eric Johnson as Treasurer and extra assistance given by Tim and Shirley Ellis, and Joyce Cooper. Margot Lyons handled the advertisements. Peggy Johnson retired from her long reign as Editor-in-Chief when she moved to Derbyshire in June 2016. She is about to be 100 years old. John Herbert intended the philosophy for the magazine to be that of a non-profit making enterprise, with all contributors, typists, editors, collators and deliverers providing their services free. The price was to be kept low, only sufficient to cover the cost of materials and the maintenance of the printing equipment. The format was similar to the current production, beginning with a Service sheet and the Rector's letter. The names and phone numbers of PCC members for the three parishes were shown and later contact details for all the village organisations were added inside the back cover. The original cover was changed in 1995, with help from Sheila Wright, to one with a circle representing the Benefice (the Charles Grant drawings of the churches were simplified by Terry Ellard in February 2004). In 1992 John Herbert was appointed to Hallow Church and after an interregnum the Revd. Canon Michael Westall was appointed Rector in 1993. Michael Westall returned to Tanzania, and after an interregnum, the Revd. Andrew Bullock was appointed Priest in Charge in 2002. Revd. Anne Potter became the Team Vicar of the West Worcestershire Rural Team with special responsibility for Alfrick with Lulsley, Leigh and Bransford and Suckley Parishes and the Associate Priest for Crown East and Rushwick in 2015.

Geoffrey Wright is first shown as one of the printers in 1993. Graham Jeynes was the principal printer and Stan Cope was also one of the team. The



magazine at this time was printed in the vestry of Alfrick Church, still using the *Gestetner* machine. Graham died in 1999 and Stan in 2001 since when various others have helped Geoff with the printing on a part-time basis. Eric Johnson remained as Treasurer until his death in 2001 when Biddy Hood took over this post. The advertisement managers have changed with time. C. Rowland took over from Margot Lyons followed by Richard Howard and Lou Cox, then Jonathan and Ginnie Wilkinson, before David and Daphne Fowler took over in 2015.

David Fowler joined *The Sphere* team in 2011 and now covers the Alfrick & Lulsley and Suckley sections. Each month Brenda Collins and Mildred Griffiths assembled a team of collators. Technology leapt forward with time. An improved (and much cleaner) printing machine was procured and most copy is now received as email attachments and put into a standard format using word processors.

Over the years the circulation of the magazine steadily increased until reaching 820 copies each month and many more voluntary deliverers are required. The price has hardly increased at all, still excellent value for 11 monthly copies. The number of advertisements also increased, though the pages required for them are kept in proportion to the news pages. The magazine does make a profit but, in keeping with John Herbert's intentions, part is given to the three parish churches and to deserving charities each year - sufficient being retained to cover machine maintenance and replacement when necessary. John Herbert would have been gratified to see that, 30 years on (as at 2013) his Benefice magazine grows in strength each year. It provides a two-way voice for both social and church events, lists contact details for local churches and societies, and the advertisements are increasingly popular as well as being a lucrative income.

The Sphere provides a rare and valuable link between the parish boundaries. With your contributions it will continue to evolve - a relevant, interesting and informative voice for the three parishes.

Alfrick Show 2020

The committee of the 69th Alfrick and Lulsley Show announce their decision, with heavy hearts, to cancel this year's show scheduled for 5 September. This is in line with organisations, up and down the country, cancelling events which attract crowds of people. Since social distancing is likely to continue for many more months and the uncertainty around the spread of coronavirus, including predictions of a second wave in the autumn, the committee felt there was no choice.

After seriously considering the implications in taking responsibility for the safety of the village, and the folk that may have attended the show, the committee felt the requirements that needed to be put in place proved to be prohibitive.

However, we are looking forward to a bonanza of a show on **Saturday**, **4 September 2021** as we go into our 70th year. Keep the date and we sincerely hope we will be able to meet again on the showground for another great community show.

Community Choir

We continue to run online rehearsals every Tuesday evening at 7.30pm, with a recording available the next day for those who couldn't make it. Alfrick Educational Charity: was created out of the sale proceeds of Alfrick Primary School and has now been in existence for over 30 years. It provides grants for educational purposes to residents of Alfrick, Lulsley and Suckley and for schools serving the children of those Parishes.



The Trustees will consider applications from students attending further educational courses during the academic year 2020/21 and are under the age of 25 at the start of their course. Also, grants are available for projects by those schools serving these parishes where there is no other source of funding available. You will still be able to ask for a shop volunteer to shop for you, if you're not yet ready to enter the shop yourself. Now that you can enter the shop again, you'll be able to see the extent of our lovely new stock! We are indebted to our local suppliers and continue to be most grateful to them for supplying fresh bread, eggs, cakes, honey, salad leaves, herbs and vegetables, beer and cider. As summer has arrived, there's a regular supply of local fresh fruit as well, of course. As for the dried goods...we've rarely been out of flour, pasta or sugars!

The Post Office has also been open every weekday with reduced hours, thanks to our brilliant volunteers, and has been constantly in demand, which is good to know.

Sadly, our Café has been closed since late March, of course, and we miss our manager and the lovely smells of baking and coffee emanating for the

kitchen. We also a miss our regular social gatherings in the Café and the customers and friends who we have got to know over a cuppa and cake or a bacon sandwich. We look forward to being able to operate the Café in some capacity as soon as possible and are looking for feedback from our customers at the moment to help us plan ahead. As you read this, there should be simple questionnaires available in the shop for customers to take away and complete. We have been thrilled with the generous response of the community since we became a collection point for *Worcester Food Bank*, on behalf of our parish churches. It's an initiative which we certainly plan to continue for the foreseeable future.

Finally, we are trying to make the community shop, and information about what's going on there, as accessible as possible to everyone in the community. Do keep an eye on our Facebook page (Alfrick and Lulsley Community Shop) which is updated regularly for all the latest news. Radar Speed report covering Alfrick and Lulsley for the period 20 April 2020 to 31 May 2020 shows that traffic counts and speeds over 50 mph have reduced

dramatically during lockdown. Some 45% of all measurements show vehicles breaking the 30mph limit, most at about 37mph. The highest speed recorded was at Swan Orchard, over 55mph at 06.35 on 28 May 2020.

A Sad Tale from Garth Lowe

This relates to the nesting attempts of a pied flycatcher which is a migrant bird from North Africa. Last year a pair turned up and used a box at the end of the log pile successfully fledging the brood. All the birds were ringed as I have a licence from the British Trust for Ornithology (BTO). These birds are now quite uncommon in the county so it was a wonderful event to take place on our doorstep. This species has nested at the southern end of the Malverns but none appeared to breed there last year.

This year on exactly the same day in April that the male turned up last year, a female arrived, unusual as the male normally selects a site and sings regularly to attract a wife. Last year it was a week before a female arrived. This year she stayed around and in just two days built a nest in the same box still with no signs of a male! The first egg was found on the 30 April and by 6 May six eggs had been laid and a few days later she was incubating them.

Having this bird turn up again, it seemed highly unlikely that another female just chanced upon a desirable box situated in woodland on a slope

typical of the hilly west of Britain, where they are more common. As they are quite small and active



when out in the trees seeing if there was a ringed leg was too difficult to establish. Still no signs of a mate but there was a slight chance she had strayed and found one to fertilise her eggs and as the males can be bigamous this was a possibility. The suspense and fingers crossing for the next two weeks occupied our thoughts. By Sunday 23 May it looked very doubtful a hatching would take place so the bird was carefully lifted and checked. Sure enough it was the same bird as last year. She was placed back again and continued to sit till 29th but seemed to be spending more time off the eggs! She was last seen on the evening of the 31st sitting in the box, but by early morning she had slipped away as quietly away as she had arrived.

Busy Bees

There is always something going on in the countryside! Recently we were in the garden when I was amazed to see the air was full (and I mean full) of insects flying around. I could hear them buzzing, and realised it was a swarm of bees. They began to settle in our crab apple tree, and about half an hour later had gathered into a swarm about 15" long and 12" diameter hanging from a branch. We phoned a neighbour who keeps bees, for advice, and later he came round with his bee-keeping outfit and equipment. He explained that a colony of bees had probably become very big and split, so part of it had flown off to find another home, most likely with the old queen. The bees were calm and non-aggressive as they were just looking for a new house.



With his beekeeping protection on he puffed some powder over the bees to keep them calm, then cut off the small branch to which the swarm had attached itself. He put the bit of branch and the swarm in a large cardboard box which he put on the ground. He then left it for about ten minutes as the bees still flying round

went into the box to be with the swarm - quite amazing but they have a 'herd instinct'. When most of them were in the box he taped it up, collected all his equipment and put the box of bees on the back seat of his car.



He thought there were about 15,000 bees in this swarm and when I asked what he would do with them and he said that he could add them to his hives at home. This was fascinating to watch - but neither of us has ever seen bees swarm before. I was relieved our neighbour drove the short way home still wearing his protective clothing, just in case any bees escaped in the car!

More bits and pieces from the wildlife world around and about

While sitting at the PC I'm looking jealously at the large cherry tree outside my window loaded with ripening but diminishing numbers of big juicy red cherries. The tree is currently a huge food source; sadly not for us - we're left with not-quite-ripe ones. All manner of animals have been feasting: female blackbirds feeding cherries to their young on the ground, males carrying away cherries from high up and noisily trying to defend them from other males. Likewise with crows and magpies. Further within the tree and on the rambling rose branches, various tits have been hopping around feeding on aphids. Underneath on the ground, we've also seen at least three squirrels and a rat enjoying the feast, and unseen overnight there is badger evidence and of our resident hedgehog. It's been a good year for young birds being fed by their parents at our peanut and seed feeders: large numbers of blue tits, great tits, goldfinches, house sparrows, robin and a first for us, two nut hatches feeding a juvenile.

The warmth and now the rain have encouraged more butterflies, moths and of course aphids - blackfly again on our broad beans competing with us for food, and plenty of red and black ants emerging from tiny holes dotted about our lawn, along cracks in paving slabs and from large

mounds in the rough grass around the garden. The tops of these anthills in wildflower meadows often have different grasses and plants from the surrounding meadow, usually small rock-type plants adapted to drier warmer, sandier places. Back to moths: on our unmowed grass verge (saved from the flail mower) earlier, in April we saw scarlet tiger moth caterpillars munching comfrey leaves and very recently, the moths themselves including a couple mating on the leaves. These strikingly colourful moths are similar in size to medium-sized butterflies, having iridescent blackish or navy-blue wings with cream, yellow and red blotches when at rest, opening in flight to reveal bright scarlet. In our garden, to my dismay I observed the now annual destruction of most of the Solomon's seal leaves by vast numbers of smallish grey caterpillar-like larvae of the Solomon's seal sawfly; at least they don't kill the plant. Walking along our lanes I have been looking for long stretches of grey, silky webbing protecting ermine moth caterpillars eating their way through hedgerow hawthorn, blackthorn, spindle and other leaves; again the hedges recover. Look out for these strange massive webs. The attractive silky ermine-like small moths emerge later in the summer. **Carol Bradley**




Broadwas Croquet Club: Lawns Update

COVID-19 in Low Income countries - Domestos and Lifebuoy to the rescue!



Our news is full of COVID-19, and the mood is one of optimism here in the UK. In Africa and other Low-Income Countries, the mood is one of fear of this strange plague about which rumours abound. "Is it true you can cure the virus with black tea?" "Would it help to burn certain roots and inhale the smoke?" A Medair Volunteer was pleased to find that explaining about correct hand washing and not shaking hands or gathering in

groups lifted the mood and people felt more confident because they could easily do those things.

The spread of COVID-19 has increased the sense of fear in communities, particularly in resource limited settings. Hand washing is a key component to reduce the spread of COVID-19, but in low income countries access to hand washing is limited. https://doi.org/10.1289/EHP7200 and there is a high correlation between the risk of dying from COVID-19 and poor access to safe drinking water and safe sanitation. https://www.medrxiv.org/content/10.1101/2020.06.08.20125864v1

The recent headline *DfID merges with the Foreign Office* could be a tragedy for low income countries and for the UK – *DfID* has been a world leader in the fight against poverty and in seeking vaccines for Covid and many preventable diseases. The CEO of Oxfam UK said, "It is scarcely believable that at a time when decades of progress are under threat from COVID-19, the prime minister has decided to scrap *DfID* – a world leader in the fight against poverty." CEO of Bond, representing international development organisations said, "Scrapping *DfID* now puts the international response to COVID-19 in jeopardy and, at a time when we need global cooperation, risks a resurgence of the disease both abroad and here in the UK."

- For example this one being led by *Unilever's Domestos* bleach and *Lifebuoy* soap, which have been driving large scale hygiene behaviour change programmes for decades.

The programme will reach up to a billion people worldwide, raising awareness and changing behaviour, to make sure people are washing their hands with soap regularly and disinfecting surfaces.

It is backed by funding of £50 million each from the Department for International Development (DfID) and *Unilever*. The programme will provide over 20 million hygiene products in the developing world, including in areas where there is little or no sanitation.

Such support is vital to stop the spread of

the disease in the developing world and will also limit its further potential spread in the UK. Tackling the disease in developing countries will also reduce its potential future impact on the global economy and travel.

How can we help practically? <u>Toilet Twinning</u> helps directly. By "twinning" your toilet YOU are providing the funds to set up a sanitation project in the area of your chosen toilet providing not only the toilet but handing washing facilities and training (<u>TearFund</u> is the partner organisation setting up the <u>projects</u>).

Conquest Theatre, Bromyard, Background Continued



As the theatre construction continued, gradually it started to look, to us, something like a theatre. In reality it was just a bare shell, no fixtures or fittings of any sort. We had an open day so people could come along and see

what it may be like and didn't really expect many to come along, but one bright chilly Sunday around 250 people came to see us. They were taken in groups around the building and offered hot drinks at the end! This was six months before we finally opened the doors for the first night performance.

Now the members started to get busy, decorating and doing all manner of jobs. We had a brilliant electrical person who designed and made the entire stage lighting rig and spent hours threading cables here and there from the control room to the stage. We had local man to design and build the metal frame that is over the stage that supports the lighting, and carries the tracks for the various stage drapes. He also designed and built a brilliant spiral staircase that allows access from the control room to the stage and although he had never made one before it fitted perfectly and still to this day is as good as new. Stage drapes were made by another local man from *Finishing Touches*. But carpeting; now there's another thing!

The carpet that is in the theatre is the original and wearing remarkably well considering the number of feet that have walked over it. *Brinton's Carpets* in Kidderminster supplied it and it was apparently an "end of roll" carpet from that designed for a cruise ship - no wonder it has lasted!

The auditorium was completed first to enable the seats to be installed. This was done by a professional company - who had taken the 100 seats from the original *Conquest Theatre*, re-covered them, and then found a further 50 that were made in a similar period and refurbished them. Meanwhile the time was drawing ever nearer to the opening of the theatre. The first play was being rehearsed on the stage, amidst all the noise and mess of construction and fitting out.

Finally the opening night was here, but in the hours before, just like the old tin shed theatre, "decoration" was still taking place!

Then with just two hours to spare all of us dashed off to get changed and ready for the opening performance. Tuesday 10 December 1991, a misty and cold evening, but an auspicious date as it was the opening night of the new

CORONAVIRUS – COVID-19 LATEST UPDATE FROM THE TRUSTEES OF THE LEIGH AND BRANSFORD MEMORIAL HALL: JULY 2020

1. The latest situation – some limited reopening of the Hall may be possible in July subject to strict hygiene regimes and social-distancing conditions being in place

At the time of writing (mid-June) the Hall Trustees expect Step 3 of the UK Government's plan to get back to normal (called *Our Plan To Rebuild*) will allow for village halls to reopen (subject to strict conditions being in place) from Saturday 4th July. The Trustees are currently working through the guidance and requirements to conduct the necessary risk assessments and adjustments needed to ensure compliance. *However, it is already clear that with no immediate change likely to reduce the social distancing 2 metre rule, hires for more crowded events such as parties, wedding receptions and other informal social gatherings will not be permitted until later.* We already know that for many of our regular groups, especially those designed for young children like Brownies and Rainbows, or attended by older and retired people, their meetings will recommence only when a greater level of public confidence returns about safely mixing indoors with others outside their 'bubble'. And this may be some, indeed many, months off.

That said, the Trustees are busy understanding and making the necessary preparations in order to comply with the stringent reopening conditions. The work involved suggests that it is unlikely the Hall will be ready to open on Saturday 4th July but the Trustees hope to be ready for some limited re-opening – subject to revised conditions of hire being in place – later in the month.


